News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have read the story of The Odd Fish. We focused on the interesting vocabulary and sequencing the story. We created story maps to help us retell the story in our own words and we used the story to help us learn about the dangers of plastic in the ocean. In maths, we focused on representing the numbers 6, 7 and 8; we practised adding one to different numbers and

ordering them to create a staircase pattern. We all loved lino printing fish to represent the characters in our story.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our science lesson. We have been learning about habitats, identifying features of different habitats and considering which animals live there. In English this week, we have been looking at travel leaflets, how they are constructed and what's included in them, in preparation to write our own travel leaflet. In maths, Year 1 have been counting on to add 2-digit numbers together whilst Year 2 have been using part whole models to help them with their additions. In computing, we have been collecting and recording our own data and in RE we have been learning about the twelve disciples in the Bible and why Jesus was a special friend to them.

News from Class 3

This week in maths, we started to learn formal methods of short multiplication, focusing on multiplying a 3-digit number by a 1-digit number. In English, we used some of the content from our mystery stories in our grammar lessons on fronted adverbials. We learned all about Mother Teresa in RE and how her committed religious beliefs changed her life and those of others around her. In French, we prepared some oral phrases to use in our first attempt at short written French sentences. We have practised our talent show pieces and some Class 3 members attended the fabulous Young Voices concert in Manchester yesterday. We have also completed a lovely art activity as part of Children's Mental Health week.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been exploring volume and learning to calculate the volume of a cuboid. In English, we have been completing our biographies about Harriet Tubman, linked to our current English book 'Unspoken' by Henry Cole. Another highlight has been the children writing such wonderful personification poems about freedom, linked to our learning about the story of Exodus in RE. We have also enjoyed a busy week filled with Talent Show rehearsals and Young Voices.

Sports News

Class 1 – In PE this week, we were different animals, moving around habitats using gymnastic equipment: crocodiles climbing across the bench and into the water, bears in the cave, lions climbing

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up a bench and jumping off pride rock, snakes slithering under things and lastly monkeys climbing the trees and sliding down the branches.

Class 2 – This week, in gymnastics we did sequences with partners, including a jump, a balance, and a roll. We also looked at target practice playing battle ships, with teams of 3 on a mat, trying to land a bean bag onto another team's ship to remove a life.

Class 3 – We have looked at sequences in gymnastics in 2s or 3s. All routines should include a roll, balance and a jump. We were looking for children to be controlled and tidy in their performances. Class 4 – This week, the gymnastics performances looked to include a balance, roll and jump each, along with using a piece of apparatus. Children were scored on control, teamwork, adaptability and creativity. In dance, we split into small groups and used I-pads to learn our dance and correct any timings we might have wrong.
