### News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have been using the book, 'The Growing Story' to inspire our learning. We have created timelines of our life and compared the different stages. We have considered how

we have changed. In maths, we have introduced the skill of subitising (recognising a quantity without touch counting). We all enjoyed collecting apples then using the apple press to squeeze fresh juice. On Thursday, it was National Poetry Day and we collectively learnt a poem about autumn and learnt how to illustrate it with leaf rubbings.

### **News from Class 2**

This week, Class 2 celebrated National Poetry day on Thursday, by going on a nature walk to collect and draw natural objects which inspired our writing. We created a class poem and some children wrote their own poetry about the seasons. In maths, we looked at comparing numbers using greater than and less than, partitioned numbers using a part whole model and counted in tens on the number line. For our IPC topic, we looked at famous portraits, playing detectives to spot the clues which told us who the subject of the portrait might be. We used this as inspiration for drawing our own self portraits, capturing our hobbies and interests. We also followed the journey of a letter through the postal service.

### **News from Class 3**

This week, in maths, we have examined Roman numerals. We have learned how to read numerals to 1000 and completed some simple sums using Roman numerals. In English, we have continued our class book, 'Leon and the Place Between'. The children have sequenced key events within the story. As part of national poetry day, children took part in a live lesson where they created their own acrostic poem based on nature. In our topic of 'How Humans Work', we have studied why two eyes are better than one and created an eyesight test. In the second half of the week, children studied sound, looking at pitch and volume. The children used instruments to help with their understanding.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, in Year 5, we have completed our work on place value, focusing on rounding to various degrees of accuracy. In Year 6 we have been learning about common factors, common multiples and prime numbers to 100. In English, we have continued reading 'Boy in the Tower', by Polly Ho-Yen, and we have written a formal letter and created a wikipedia page, linked to the events in the story. In IPC, we have continued our new unit, '900CE', focusing on identifying primary and secondary sources of information and considering reliability and bias.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – This week, we pretended to be pirates and practised our balancing skills using lots of different equipment including the benches and beanbags.

Class 2 – In PE, we practised ball skills, sending the ball by rolling and throwing.

Class 3 – This week we played football matches, putting the rules we have learnt into practice. In basketball we also played some games and were putting our skills into practice.

Class 4 – In PE this week, we enjoyed playing football matches as we have now learnt all of the rules of the game. In basketball we had matches and were displaying evidence of excellent learning as we were utilising our newly learnt and developed skills.
